

**BEC EnviroSeries Conference – 23 May 2018
The Greater Bay Area – Leveraging opportunities
for Hong Kong in the transition towards sustainability**

Hong Kong's Chief Executive Carrie Lam highlighted in the policy address that the HKSAR Government will actively participate in taking forward the development of the Bay Area to create favourable conditions for diversifying our industries, assist Hong Kong people and enterprises to discover new opportunities, enabling us to capitalise on the unique advantages of Hong Kong in the Bay Area. Through its 13th 5 year action plan, China has also committed to take steps to clean up the environment and promote an "ecological civilisation". This implies that there are opportunities for HK business in the wider Bay Area from this transition. In this BEC EnviroSeries Conference, we will explore how Hong Kong can benefit from the Greater Bay Area (GBA) initiative.

- What are the opportunities for Hong Kong businesses that arise from Mainland plans to enhance quality of life and sustainable development of the city cluster by working to protect the environment across the region?
- What can the HKSAR Government and business organisations do to position HK businesses to grasp the opportunities of a transition to a green and low-carbon way of production and operation across the region?
- How can we take forward environmental protection through a collaborative Greater Bay Area approach to develop the regions' potential?
